MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE CRICKET SECTION HELD IN THE CLUB HOUSE, NEW ANNIESLAND ON FRIDAY 19TH SEPTEMBER AT 6.30 P.M. 2008.

1. APOLOGIES

2. MINUTES OF THE 2007 A.G.M.

These had been displayed on the Section's website for the previous four days and were approved unanimously.

3. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

John McNaught welcomed Hugh Barrow, President of the Academical Club to the meeting and remarked that the terrible weather since mid June had 'dampened' enthusiasm throughout the Club. Off all 102 Senior fixtures 70 had been played, 32 cancelled (nearly all in July/August). The 1st XI had had a "nearly" season finishing 3% behind Kelburne in the 1st Division. The 2nd XI had done well to survive in the 2nd Division and the 3rd XI and the new 4th XI had competed well in the 5th Division. The most encouraging aspect was that we had record numbers in the Section, all wanting to play cricket.

4. CAPTAIN'S REPORTS

- 1ST XI. A. Dodson reported on the "nearly" season lost second last ball to Poloc in Rowan Cup, lost narrowly to Kelburne in S.C.U. Trophy and finished second to Kelburne by 3% in 1st Division. In a season dominated by the poor weather the Tour to Paris 11th to 15th September provided better weather and three games with a win against Chantilly and a quote in the local press "they came, they saw and they conquered and such a great bunch of people will be more than welcome to come back." Andy finished by advising of the efforts required to raise money for the new nets, but that the investment would make the Club even better.
- 2^{nd} XI. Ian McKay reported that the 2^{nd} XI had done very well to stay in the 2^{nd} Division and praised notable performances from Raj Soman, Chris Hollingsworth and Chris Dunbar.
- **3rd XI.** John McNaught read a report from F. Siddiqui. P 11, W6 D1 L4 finished fourth in what had ultimately been a disappointing season which had started so well. They lost two important games and then lost out on games against weak opposition due to the rain. There were notable performances from G. Paton 98 .no., R. Paton 88 n.o., R. Patel 70 n.o., S. Murray 56 n.o., and on the bowling side M. Shields 15 wickets (despite his 10 week ban) C. Dickie 11 and S. Murray 11.
- **4th XI.** Jim McLaren reported on the team's inaugural season, when the Club had fielded four Saturday teams for the first time. Division 5 had been expanded to thirteen teams with a mid season split and produced a fixture between our 3rds and 4ths! The aims for the Season were relatively modest fulfil our fixtures, be

competitive and perhaps win a match, not finish bottom and these were met and indeed exceeded. We completed 16 of 18 fixtures W6 D2 L8, finishing 10th out of 13 and losing out on the Tom Kerr Trophy for the bottom 7 teams when losing to Ardencaple in the last game of the Season. 35 different players graced the 4th XI during the Season and the highlights included beating Crow Road in front of a sizeable crowd, dismissing Ardencaple for 29 in spite of winning the toss and electing to field with 7 players and holding out for a draw at Ardrossan, the League Leaders at the time and Ken Austin's 100 against Hillend @ Greenock for the first Century for the 4th XI. The game against the 3rd XI ? - it was lost narrowly by 9 wickets!

Midweek XI. Raj Soman reported on a team which nearly everyone in the Club had played for during the Season. The team had only won approximately 50% of the games played but it had been great fun for all concerned.

Sunday XI. R. Andrew reported on a Season ravaged by the weather with 8 matches cancelled. P6 W2 L4 and finishing 4th in the League.

Juniors. Colin Dawson reported on all the Juniors teams, (the lifeblood for the Club's future) and in particular on the increased numbers, 74 in all with 28 @ U11 The Season like the weather had been very mixed. (The weather appears to have been better midweek then at the weekend!).
